

"He's not in – go away", Vulcan barked in no uncertain terms. "Oh, leave it out" said Vulcan's mum, Spitfire, "he looks harmless enough to me". Moments later, my trouser legs still intact, Neil got back from the school run, and a wide-ranging conversation ensued. Rather than serialise it, I'll summarise it as best I can!

**Rikki:** Yours must be one of the oldest families in the village. How far can you trace the association back?

**Neil:** Records of the family begin in Aldbury. The family moved to Stilton in the late 1700s but returned to Aldbury and to Dagnall, where a wing of the family still lives. Ivinghoe Aston Farm was built in 1830 and my great grandfather was a tenant to the Ashridge Estate. The National Trust took over after WW1 and, as tenant, my grandfather, Thomas Ashby, had first dibs on purchasing, which he did. When the depression hit, he had the idea of building the lime works. Ashby Villas were built to house farmworkers and kiln workers. Before the farm, the village was concentrated much more towards the north-west end and had almost died out. Half the kiln is still intact, near the layby – it has a heritage order on it. It's home to bats and a bloke turns up to check them out every now and then.

**Rikki:** What does your farming operation comprise now?

**Neil:** I now confine myself to sheep and landlording. I have 640 acres but all the arable is rented out. I used to do dairy but stopped that in 2001.

**Rikki:** So, being in agriculture, what's your take on Brexit?

**Neil:** I voted leave but it wasn't an easy decision. Every single rule comes from Brussels. Set-aside worked okay as a way of maintaining the economy whilst not overproducing, and I'm very much in favour in principle of payments for environmental stewardship, but the paperwork was horrendous and I now do pretty much all the environmental work off my own bat.

**Rikki:** What are your biggest bugbears as a landowner?

**Neil:** Fly tipping, without a doubt. Some of it, like wood and hardcore, I can make use of, but asbestos dumped on bridleways and leaky drums of waste engine oil in the brooks are no joke. The Council and the Environment Agency are usually no help, and the (often considerable) costs fall on me.

**Rikki:** Changing the subject completely, I recall you once telling me that you are a Druid. I was hence a little surprised to see you and your family at the Christmas morning service at St Mary's. How does that work?

Neil: Actually it gets better! A couple of months back I had the Bishop of Oxford round. Adrian, the vicar, was hosting the Bishop, who said that he would like to visit a working farm. Adrian asked me, the "parish pagan"! My family have been heavily in tune with the Anglican Church. My grandmother and grandfather were church wardens and I'm still a member (but half expecting to get thrown out!). Christianity has much of its roots in paganism and I don't have too much difficulty reconciling the two. Five hundred Christian saints are pagan deities. I particularly like the story of St Bridget, an old Celtic god of fire and an important symbol of spring and renewal. She is now the patron saint of blacksmiths, firefighters and soldiers, so hasn't even changed her job! I have a strong belief in reincarnation and other worlds. My partner, Magda, is a Catholic, by the way.

In the ensuing half-hour I learnt a great deal, including a clear connection between pagan philosophy and modern quantum mechanics theory on parallel universes and multiverse bubbles. There you go.

**Rikki:** So back in our universe, how would you like to see lvinghoe Aston develop?



**Neil:** I dream of Ivinghoe Aston as a self-sufficient community, with union flags flattering over everyone's individual veggie plots and orchards. As utopian and impractical as that is, I would like to see things slowly move that way. I believe that the more self-sufficient you are, the more freedom and liberty you have, as you lessen your dependence on wider society. So please, readers, support local business before others, rent an allotment, plant a tree, take time to talk to, and know, your neighbours, and we will all be happier.



# The BeaconLit Festival



The BeaconLit Festival which has just taken place at Brookmead School was a gem. How lucky are we to have a literary festival right on our doorstep. The committee had arranged a stimulating and interesting group of speakers to come and talk to us. I was also amazed that we had such a wealth of writers who live in the two villages or connected through parents. The atmosphere during the breaks was relaxed and friendly with all participants chatting with each other.

The authors included Hugh Fraser perhaps best known for playing Capt Hastings in Poirot on TV. His third novel will be published this summer. He was in conversation with Adina Campbell from BBC South Today.

Adam Croft, who has sold more than a million thrillers, was in conversation with Dave Sivers. Rowan Coleman, who is a Sunday Times beat selling author, took part in one of the panel sessions.





The last presentation of the day was a conversation with Karen Sullivan, owner of Orenda Books. I found this fascinating. Karen set up her own publishing business about 2 years ago. She now publishes about 20 books a year and she took us through the process from the manuscript to book. A lot of her books are in translation so she has to find translators as well. There is so much involved from designing book jackets to publicity and Karen oversees it all.

Next year give yourself a treat open your mind and do something different. You never know where it might lead.

# Brilliant BeaconLit goes from Strength to Strength

ur very own literary festival, BeaconLit, took place on Saturday 8 July in Brookmead School and has been hailed as a great success by audience and participants alike.

The fifth festival included appearances by **Adam Croft**, one of the most successful independently published authors in the world; **Hugh Fraser**, best known for playing Captain Hastings in Agatha Christie's 'Poirot' and the Duke of Wellington in 'Sharpe', but also the author or three thrillers; and **Rowan Coleman**, whose fourteen novels include the bestseller *The Memory Book*.

BeaconLit's uniquely friendly and intimate 'village' atmosphere, coupled with its ability to attract an eclectic range of writers, broadcasters and publishers, have always made the festival special, and it is now established on the festival scene and going from strength to strength.

This year's event kicked off with the popular 'New Voices' panel, with rising stars *Steph Broadribb, Harriet Cummings* and *Clare Swatman*, who talked about their debut books, how they got published and what their immediate future holds. BBC TV 'South Today' presenter *Adina Campbell* conducted an entertaining interview with multi-talented *Hugh Fraser*, and then audience members could choose from an 'a la carte' menu of sessions, including a workshop run by author and blogger *Morgen Bailey*, local poet *Deborah M Hodgetts*, and freelance writer *Sandra Smith*.

After a break, *Adam Croft* was grilled by fellow crime fiction author *Dave Sivers* about his stunning success since his self-



published debut in 2011. He's now sold over a million books. *Rowan Coleman* led a panel of very different women authors – *Jean Fullerton, Christina Jones* and Pitstone's own *Hywela Lyn* – on 'What's in a Genre?' Apparently 80% of book buyers are women, yet some books are classed as 'women's fiction'. 'Why can't fiction just be fiction?' the panel pondered. The day ended with a lively 'in conversation' session with dynamic one-woman publishing house *Karen Sullivan* of Orenda Books talking to *Sandra Smith* about the fast-moving publishing landscape and what it takes for a small, agile publisher to succeed.

Throughout the day books were available from Chorleywood Bookshop, and there were beverages and snacks available. The day was supported by Bucks County Council, Orenda Books, The Haldi, Pitstone and Tesco, Tring.

A prime example of what our community is capable of, the festival is entirely run and staffed by volunteers and raises funds for our own Beacon Villages Community Library. **BeaconLlt 2018** will again be held at Brookmead School on **Saturday 14 July 2018. Save the date now!**

# Ivinghoe Allotments **Tales** from the **Plot**



Provide the August edition of the Beacon magazine. I do hope that you have all enjoyed the glorious weather that we have had these last few weeks, but despite that you do hear moans of 'it's too hot', 'we need rain'. We can do nothing about it as we are generally not used to these high temperatures and that also applies to the various plants and vegetables that we grow on our plots.

It has been a strange growing season. Talking to other plot holders, some have their second early potatoes already lifted and stored away and it is only the middle of July as I am writing this article. Again, beetroot and broad beans are early due to the weather – which in one respect is great if you have a second sowing waiting.

Once again, this year I planted my first early potatoes under black plastic, Arran Pilot and Pentland Javelin varieties and I have not been disappointed. Medium sized potatoes with excellent taste with a knob of butter. I can recommend 'The Express' broad bean variety as it is true to its name. Great pods of tender tasty beans – they freeze well and do not discolour.

The garlic that I planted in early November last year turned out to be very disappointing, but as we all remember we had an overall mild winter, not a lot of frost which garlic need to generate the cloves. The only consolation is that the Elephant garlic lived up to its name!

One of the joys of growing your own is when it comes to the time of picking your peas off the plant. This year has been a good crop, full pods of tasty peas and they do not need a lot of space. What more do you need? A good lamb cutlet, your home-grown peas and first early potatoes with butter on.

The courgettes, yellow squashes and

butternut squash are all doing well at the time of reporting. They will make excellent soups for the coming winter months.

This year I decided to experiment with my leeks. Once they were established I put a plastic pipe over some of them, covering all the leaves and pushing it three inches into the ground. Hopefully I will have longer white stems when they're ready to harvest.

These last few weeks the lvinghoe Allotment Site has been looking great; green and vibrant and well done to the plot holders for looking after their plots so well.

Please don't forget our Open Day on Saturday 19th August 2017 when the allotment site will be open from 1pm until 4pm for all to have a look and see what we do up there. You will be made very welcome and there will be a few plot holders in attendance to answer any queries you may have. The Open Day has been advertised for a few weeks now with notices on the site board, entrance and on the Town Hall notice board.

Please note another date for your diary. The lvinghoe Flower and Vegetable Show on Saturday 9th September 2017 2pm until 4pm. Schedules and entry forms are available from the local shops, the library and the lvinghoe Parish Council website.

Don't forget this a community event and if your vegetables are not perfectly straight or round then still enter because there may be a veggie buyer that would like to buy your lot! Last year was a great show – let's make this year's even better.

We are indeed very fortunate where we are.



People are being telephoned and told they may qualify for a refund and then asked for their bank account details so the payment can be made. In previous cases they have been asked for an administration fee too.

Jeff Membery, AVDC Assistant Director for Customer Fulfilment, said: "We have reported these incidents to Bucks Trading Standards but are concerned that other residents could fall for this scam and lose money. We urge everyone to be vigilant and not to give out any sensitive information to unknown callers, either on the phone or in person".


