C/008/24. Ivinghoe (Ben Hamilton Bailee) Traffic Calming Scheme – Station Road and

Maud Jane Close Junction. Councillor Bexson explained the Councillors have discussed the new reduced scheme proposed by Buckinghamshire Council. Councillor Bexson explained that the new proposed scheme, different to the one published last year will not calm the traffic, as the previous scheme would have done. The previous scheme has been replaced and re-designed by Buckinghamshire Council to reduce costs.

Councillor Bexson stated that the new scheme has incurred additional costs of £4,471.69 for surveys £503.31 Councillor Bexson stated the £4,975 should be deducted from the invoice to be issued by Buckinghamshire Council. Councillor Brazier suggested a further amount should be challenged.

It was agreed to reject the scheme proposed by Buckinghamshire Council and the earmarked reserves will be allocated to alternative capital projects including traffic calming.
